1. In our relationship to the Lord (refers to J see Eph 1:2,3,15,17, etc)
2. In the p that the Lord possesses
a. His ultimate demonstration of power was when He rose from the d

1. He knew God's power was not limited by this
 He saw God is power was not inflict by this He saw God use his imprisonment to spread the g even more so (Phil 1:12-15)

b. They exist in the "heavenlies" (KJV – high places), which means in places (see			
Eph 1:3 sermon)			
3. Every day we must realize that we are in a spiritual battle!
