Pressure Produces Perseverance (3)

● The starting domino is tribulation (trouble, affliction)

 - 3) Acts 11:19 – the persecution of believers after the stoning of Stephen was called tribulation
 - 4) Rev 1:9 – John wrote that he was a fellow partaker with the c_____ in tribulation.
 - 5) Rev 7:9 – pictures all believers (from every tribe, tongue, etc) as coming out of the G_____ tribulation)
 - b. It sometimes refers to troubles in general
 - 1) Jn 16:21 – l_____ pains of child birth
 - 2) Matt 24:21 – the events leading up to the destruction of Jerusalem, which happened in _____ A.D.
 - 3) Acts 7:11 – problems that accompany f_____
 - 4) 1 Cor 7:28 – m_____ pressures
 - 5) Jms 1:27 – widow & orphan pressures

 - 3) I Cor 15:1,2 – Paul states that the if a person who seems to have been saved does not hold to the gospel, then their faith was in v_____ (empty, not faith at all)
