a. Do not use the excuse: "That is not my spiritual gift"	
b. All believers are to respond to opportunities to do physical tasks.	
●The gift of <u>TEACHING</u> – only some have this gift, but all	
believers have the characteristic of teaching.	
1. Definition – the spiritual ability to e God's word in an understandable way.	
2. Are you taking opportunities to explain God's word?	
a. Do not use the excuse; "That is not my spiritual gift"	
b. If there is opportunity to s what you have learned from God's word, do so!	
●The gift of <u>EXHORTATION</u> – only some have this gift, but all	
believers have the characteristic of exhortation.	
1. The Greek word is very broad in meaning – literally means, <i>called alongside</i> .	
a. Jn 14:26 uses the noun form of this word as a title for the Holy Spirit (variously translated as	
H, Comforter, Advocate, Counselor)	
b. The word pictures one coming to another's aid and h them in some way.
