# CONFUSION ABOUT CONFESSION

Romans 10:9-13

### Introduction:

•Why is there so much confusion about confession today?

- 1. We tend to read the Bible through the context of our t\_\_\_\_\_\_ or religious culture.
- 2. We tend to jump to application rather than look at the scripture from the viewpoint of the original readers first.
- •We must understand the scripture correctly to apply it correctly

### **Confusion About the Meaning of Confession (9a)**

•What does the word "confess" mean?

- 1. To a Catholic? admitting (based on the practice of telling sins to a p\_\_\_\_\_)
- 2. To a Protestant? admitting (based on the practice of telling sins to G\_\_\_\_\_)
- •What does the word "confess" mean to the first-century reader?
  - 1. The Greek word literally means "to speak the s\_\_\_\_\_"
    - a. I Jn 1:9 we have to speak the same about our sin as whom? (circle one) 1) society
      - 2) priest, pastor
      - 3) God
    - b. Confessing sin is more than just admitting sin; it is h\_\_\_\_\_\_ sin and wanting nothing to do with it (that is how God speaks of sin)
  - 2. To confess Jesus as Lord, means that we must agree with God about the L\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus.

### **Confusion About the Manner of Confession (9b,10)**

•The Greek tense of the word "confess"

- 1. Does NOT point to an ongong action (present tense)
- 2. DOES point to an o\_\_\_\_\_ and for all action (aorist tense)
- •How is this confession expressed once and for all?
  - 1. Are the following passages saying different things on how to be saved? \_\_\_\_\_, they are saying the same thing but in different ways.
    - a. Acts 2:38 Repent...and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
      - 1) Some say that baptism is necessary for salvation, but if this were true e\_\_\_\_\_ passage on salvation would include baptism.
      - 2) Every first century person viewed Christian baptism as the p\_\_\_\_\_ way of identifying with Jesus as their Lord. Submitting to baptism was their faith response.
      - 3) The focus of this passage is on faith in the p\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus "in the name of Jesus Christ"
    - b. Acts 16:31 Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved.
      - 1) Faith cannot occur without r\_\_\_\_\_
      - 2) The focus of this passage is on faith in the p\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus "the Lord Jesus"
    - c. Rom 10:9 If you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved.

- 1) The other passages do not mention the resurrection, but remember the <u>g\_\_\_\_\_</u> was preached to the 3000 and to the jailor, which communicated the resurrection (I Cor 15:3,4)
- 2) Confession and believing in the heart go hand-in-hand (see verse 10 with the heart a person believes <u>resulting in righteousness</u>, and with the mouth he confesses <u>resulting in salvation</u>.)
  - a) Is this talking about two different results? \_\_\_\_, salvation is being declared righteous!
  - b) One cannot confess without believing in the heart!
- 2. Ultimately, confession is expressed in the once and for all action of trusting in the person of Jesus (who He is to you and what He did for you)

## **Confusion About the Matter of Confession (11-13)**

•These verses explain what Jesus being "Lord" means.

- 1. Verse 11 quotes Is 28:16, which is a prophecy about the coming C\_\_\_\_\_\_. Paul applies to Jesus (*whoever believes in Him [Jesus as Lord] will not be disappointed*).
- 2. Verse 12 defines what Paul means by whoever believes:
  - a. Whoever you are, whether Jew or G\_\_\_\_
  - b. ALL who c\_\_\_\_\_ on Him (the Lord Jesus)
- 3. Verse 12 also tells us that Jesus is L\_\_\_\_\_ of all who believe.
- 4. Verse 13 is a quote from Joel 2:32 which Paul applies uses to clarify what it means to confess Jesus as Lord.
  - a. In Joel 2:32, your Bibles will have the word LORD in all capitals, which the forward of your Bible explains is the H\_\_\_\_\_ name of God Yahweh (sometimes pronounced Jehovah)
  - b. Therefore, to confess Jesus as Lord is to trust in Him as Yahweh your God.

**Conclusion:** - now that we have understood this passage as the first century reader did, we can now properly apply it.

- •Use this passage to confirm your salvation experience.
- •Let this passage equip you to show people who Jesus is and what salvation is.
