•Paul was formerly a religious Jew, a P	
When he came to Christ:	
1. He disappeared from the public view for years (Gal 1:17,18), to be personally tutored by the risen Lord.	
2. He came to an understanding of how the Old Covenant was fulfilled in the N covenant	
 a. The purpose of the Old Covenant was to create a h people for God (Ex 19:5,6) – instead it showed how sinful people were.)
b. God made the New Covenant in the b of Jesus (Jer 31:31-34; Lk 22:20))
to bring people into relationship with Him.	
 We are no longer to related to Him through Laws but through J	
2) That relationship makes us holy, which means "set a" from the world.	
c. Therefore, the purpose of the Old Covenant of creating a holy people was fulfilled in	
the New Covenant.

2. Something is unclean to the person who t it is unclean. ●Two actions that relate to "a stumbling block"	
1. Negative – do not h your fellow Christian or destroy them by your actions.	
2. Positive – walk in l (agape – to seek the good of another without any	
thought for yourself)	
●Case study – a believer is trying to quit smoking because they	
believe it violates their relationship to God. You however, do not	
believe you are addicted but can smoke and still glorify God.
