## Ex 16:1-7,13-21

- <sup>1</sup>Then they set out from Elim, and all the congregation of the sons of Israel came to the wilderness of Sin, which is between Elim and Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the second month after their departure from the land of Egypt.

<sup>22</sup> Now it came about on the sixth day they gathered twice as much bread, two omers for each one. When all the leaders of the congregation came and told Moses, <sup>23</sup> then he said to them, "This is what the LORD meant: Tomorrow is a sabbath observance, a holy sabbath to the LORD. Bake what you will bake and boil what you will boil, and all that is left over put aside to be kept until morning." <sup>24</sup> So they put it aside until morning, as Moses had ordered, and it did not become foul, nor was there any worm in it. <sup>25</sup> And Moses said, "Eat it today, for today is a sabbath to the LORD; today you will not find it in the field. <sup>26</sup> Six days you shall gather it, but on the seventh day, *the* sabbath, there will be none." <sup>27</sup> And it came about on the seventh day that some of the people went out to gather, but they found none. <sup>28</sup> Then the LORD said to Moses, "How long do you refuse to keep My commandments and My instructions? <sup>29</sup> "See, the LORD has given you the sabbath; therefore He gives you bread for two days on the sixth day. Remain every man in his place; let no man go out of his place on the seventh day." <sup>30</sup> So the people rested on the seventh day.

<sup>31</sup> And the house of Israel named it manna, and it was like coriander seed, white; and its taste was like wafers with honey. <sup>32</sup> Then Moses said, "This is what the LORD has commanded, 'Let an omerful of it be kept throughout your generations, that they may see the bread that I fed you in the wilderness, when I brought you out of the land of Egypt.'" <sup>33</sup> And Moses said to Aaron, "Take a jar and put an omerful of manna in it, and place it before the LORD, to be kept throughout your generations." <sup>34</sup> As the LORD commanded Moses, so Aaron placed it before the Testimony, to be kept. <sup>35</sup> And the sons of Israel ate the manna forty years, until they came to an inhabited land; they ate the manna until they came to the border of the land of Canaan. <sup>36</sup> (Now an omer is a tenth of an ephah.)

## **Num 11**

11 Now the people became like those who complain of adversity in the hearing of the LORD; and when the LORD heard *it*, His anger was kindled, and the fire of the LORD burned among them and consumed *some* of the outskirts of the camp. <sup>2</sup> The people therefore cried out to Moses, and Moses prayed to the LORD, and the fire died out. <sup>3</sup> So the name of that place was called Taberah, because the fire of the LORD burned among them.

<sup>4</sup> And the rabble who were among them had greedy desires; and also the sons of Israel wept again and said, "Who will give us meat to eat? <sup>5</sup> "We remember the fish which we used to eat free in Egypt, the cucumbers and the melons and the leeks and the onions and the garlic, <sup>6</sup> but now our appetite is gone. There is nothing at all to look at except this manna." <sup>7</sup> Now the manna was like coriander seed, and its appearance like that of bdellium. <sup>8</sup> The people would go about and gather *it* and grind *it* between two millstones or beat *it* in the mortar, and boil *it* in the pot and make cakes with it; and its taste was as the taste of cakes baked with oil. <sup>9</sup> And when the dew fell on the camp at night, the manna would fall with it.

<sup>10</sup> Now Moses heard the people weeping throughout their families, each man at the doorway of his tent; and the anger of the LORD was kindled greatly, and Moses was displeased. <sup>11</sup> So Moses said to the LORD, "Why hast Thou been so hard on Thy servant? And why have I not found favor in Thy sight, that Thou hast laid the burden of all this people on me? <sup>12</sup> "Was it I who conceived all this people? Was it I who brought them forth, that Thou shouldest say to me, 'Carry them in your bosom as a nurse carries a nursing infant, to the land which Thou didst swear to their fathers'? <sup>13</sup> "Where am I to get meat to give to all this people? For they weep before me, saying, 'Give us meat that we may eat!' <sup>14</sup> "I alone am not able to carry all this people, because it is too burdensome for

me. <sup>15</sup> So if Thou art going to deal thus with me, please kill me at once, if I have found favor in Thy sight, and do not let me see my wretchedness."

<sup>16</sup> The LORD therefore said to Moses, "Gather for Me seventy men from the elders of Israel, whom you know to be the elders of the people and their officers and bring them to the tent of meeting, and let them take their stand there with you. 17 Then I will come down and speak with you there, and I will take of the Spirit who is upon you, and will put Him upon them; and they shall bear the burden of the people with you, so that you shall not bear it all alone. 18 And say to the people, 'Consecrate yourselves for tomorrow, and you shall eat meat; for you have wept in the ears of the LORD, saying," Oh that someone would give us meat to eat! For we were well-off in Egypt. "Therefore the LORD will give you meat and you shall eat. 19 'You shall eat, not one day, nor two days, nor five days, nor ten days, nor twenty days, 20 but a whole month, until it comes out of your nostrils and becomes loathsome to you; because you have rejected the LORD who is among you and have wept before Him, saying, "Why did we ever leave Egypt?"" 21 But Moses said, "The people, among whom I am, are 600,000 on foot; yet Thou hast said, 'I will give them meat in order that they may eat for a whole month.' 22 "Should flocks and herds be slaughtered for them, to be sufficient for them? Or should all the fish of the sea be gathered together for them, to be sufficient for them?" 23 And the LORD said to Moses, "Is the LORD's power limited? Now you shall see whether My word will come true for you or not."

<sup>24</sup> So Moses went out and told the people the words of the LORD . Also, he gathered seventy men of the elders of the people, and stationed them around the tent. <sup>25</sup> Then the LORD came down in the cloud and spoke to him; and He took of the Spirit who was upon him and placed *Him* upon the seventy elders. And it came about that when the Spirit rested upon them, they prophesied. But they did not do *it* again.

<sup>26</sup> But two men had remained in the camp; the name of one was Eldad and the name of the other Medad. And the Spirit rested upon them (now they were among those who had been registered, but had not gone out to the tent), and they prophesied in the camp. <sup>27</sup> So a young man ran and told Moses and said, "Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp." <sup>28</sup> Then Joshua the son of Nun, the attendant of Moses from his youth, answered and said, "Moses, my lord, restrain them." <sup>29</sup> But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the LORD's people were prophets, that the LORD would put His Spirit upon them!" <sup>30</sup> Then Moses returned to the camp, *both* he and the elders of Israel.

<sup>31</sup> Now there went forth a wind from the LORD, and it brought quail from the sea, and let *them* fall beside the camp, about a day's journey on this side and a day's journey on the other side, all around the camp, and about two cubits *deep* on the surface of the ground. <sup>32</sup> And the people spent all day and all night and all the next day, and gathered the quail (he who gathered least gathered ten homers) and they spread *them* out for themselves all around the camp. <sup>33</sup> While the meat was still between their teeth, before it was chewed, the anger of the LORD was kindled against the people, and the LORD struck the people with a very severe plague. <sup>34</sup> So the name of that place was called Kibroth-hattaavah, because there they buried the people who had been greedy. <sup>35</sup> From Kibroth-hattaavah the people set out for Hazeroth, and they remained at Hazeroth.

### 1 Sam 8

**8** And it came about when Samuel was old that he appointed his sons judges over Israel. <sup>2</sup> Now the name of his first-born was Joel, and the name of his second, Abijah; *they* were judging in Beersheba. <sup>3</sup> His sons, however, did not walk in his ways, but turned aside after dishonest gain and took bribes and perverted justice.

<sup>4</sup> Then all the elders of Israel gathered together and came to Samuel at Ramah; <sup>5</sup> and they said to him, "Behold, you have grown old, and your sons do not walk in your ways. Now appoint a king

for us to judge us like all the nations." <sup>6</sup> But the thing was displeasing in the sight of Samuel when they said, "Give us a king to judge us." And Samuel prayed to the LORD. <sup>7</sup> And the LORD said to Samuel, "Listen to the voice of the people in regard to all that they say to you, for they have not rejected you, but they have rejected Me from being king over them. <sup>8</sup> Like all the deeds which they have done since the day that I brought them up from Egypt even to this day — in that they have forsaken Me and served other gods — so they are doing to you also. <sup>9</sup> Now then, listen to their voice; however, you shall solemnly warn them and tell them of the procedure of the king who will reign over them."

<sup>10</sup> So Samuel spoke all the words of the LORD to the people who had asked of him a king. <sup>11</sup> And he said, "This will be the procedure of the king who will reign over you: he will take your sons and place *them* for himself in his chariots and among his horsemen and they will run before his chariots. <sup>12</sup> And he will appoint for himself commanders of thousands and of fifties, and *some* to do his plowing and to reap his harvest and to make his weapons of war and equipment for his chariots. <sup>13</sup> He will also take your daughters for perfumers and cooks and bakers. <sup>14</sup> And he will take the best of your fields and your vineyards and your olive groves, and give *them* to his servants. <sup>15</sup> And he will take a tenth of your seed and of your vineyards, and give to his officers and to his servants. <sup>16</sup> He will also take your male servants and your female servants and your best young men and your donkeys, and use *them* for his work. <sup>17</sup> He will take a tenth of your flocks, and you yourselves will become his servants. <sup>18</sup> Then you will cry out in that day because of your king whom you have chosen for yourselves, but the LORD will not answer you in that day."

<sup>19</sup> Nevertheless, the people refused to listen to the voice of Samuel, and they said, "No, but there shall be a king over us, <sup>20</sup> that we also may be like all the nations, that our king may judge us and go out before us and fight our battles." <sup>21</sup> Now after Samuel had heard all the words of the people, he repeated them in the LORD's hearing. <sup>22</sup> And the LORD said to Samuel, "Listen to their voice, and appoint them a king." So Samuel said to the men of Israel, "Go every man to his city."
