Share Our Faith With One Another – Philemon 1:4-7
•The apostle Paul writes to Philemon and:

• Calls his action as the koinonia (fellowship, sharing, communication) of his f (v. 6)
• Sees the result of his actions as refreshing the h of believers.

1. It is NOT playing games or e with one another (I am not saying that we should not do this, for sharing of our faith can occur in these things)

(Jn 13:35 – love one another unselfishly)
•About 10 years ago a church-wide anonymous survey was conducted on why one attends LBC.

2. 74% - because of the pastor.
