#### Non-Negotiables of a Disciple

#### Part 2- The Worth of Jesus Matthew 10

### Introduction

- •We learned last week that:
  - No disciple is a \_\_\_\_\_ his teacher and no slave is a \_\_\_\_\_ his master (v. 24)
  - 2. If we are d\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus and slaves of Jesus, we then must submit to His authority.
  - 3. His w\_\_\_\_\_ (what He has said) is non-negotiable the B\_\_\_\_\_\_ is His word.
- •Today we will look at the w\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus.
  - The Pharisees viewed Jesus as worthless by claiming He was possessed by the d\_\_\_\_\_ (Beelzebul was the nickname for Satan – Mk 3:22; Matt 9:34)
  - 2. The worth of Jesus is not in the e\_\_\_\_\_ of the beholder, but is objective.
  - 3. His worth s \_\_\_\_\_ everyone's and everything's worth, individually and combined.
- •Does your life demonstrate the objective worth of Jesus?

# Does your life demonstrate that Jesus is worth more than your comfort? (26,27)

- •Jesus never promised that a disciple's life would be e\_\_\_\_\_, although it would be better.
  - 1. No longer slaves of s\_\_\_\_\_ (better).
  - 2. Em\_\_\_\_\_\_to live Jesus's way (better).
- •Jesus did promise o\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 25)
  - 1. If Jesus, being one person, would be opposed (He was called a d\_\_\_\_\_)
  - 2. How much more will His disciples, being m\_\_\_\_\_, be opposed.
  - We are not to f\_\_\_\_\_ persecution (v. 26) but we are to spread His word (v. 27; see also Matt 28:19; Acts 1:8 where similar commands are given to ALL disciples).
- •When has an opportunity to tell about Jesus interrupted your ease?
  - 1. Jehovah's Witnesses and Mormons coming to your door

- 2. Going on a short-term mission trip
- 3. Family, friends, neighbors
- •My ease is negotiable. But the worth of Jesus is not!

## Does your life demonstrate that Jesus is worth more than your life? (28-31; 38-39)

- The life of the apostles -10 of the 12 were k\_\_\_\_\_ for their faith.
  - 1. Only one is recorded in the Bible (J\_\_\_\_\_ Acts 12:2)
  - 2. The other 10 are recorded by other historical documents.
- •The life of the disciples in the late 1<sup>st</sup> through the 2<sup>nd</sup> century
  - 1. P\_\_\_\_\_ by the Roman government
  - 2. Many were killed for their faith in cruel ways:
    - a. C\_\_\_\_\_
    - b. Sewn into carcasses and thrown to the w\_\_\_\_\_
    - c. Breaking each limb with a s\_\_\_\_\_
    - d. S\_\_\_\_\_alive
    - e. Set on f\_\_\_\_\_
- •Why does God allow such evil persecution to happen?
  - 1. It's not because He does not c\_\_\_\_\_. He does! (vv 29-31)
  - 2. The apostle's death does put a s\_\_\_\_\_\_ of genuineness on the Christian faith (there would be no reason for them to make up a resurrection story since they never gained from proclaiming this message but always sacrificed).
  - The millions of Muslims coming to Christ in the face of d\_\_\_\_\_ puts a stamp of genuineness on their faith (they have no reason to lie about it).

### •Why should we not fear persecution or the possibility of death?

- 1. For the believer death is only t\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 28a; I Cor 15:50ff)
- For the unbeliever death is e\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 28b)
  a. The word hell is better translated as Gehenna and is an equivalent to the Lake of F\_\_\_\_\_ (Rev 20:14)
  - b. Hell (hades) will eventually be t\_\_\_\_\_ into the Lake of Fire (Rev 20:14).

## •How might unbelievers try to find THE LIFE? (*He who wishes to find his life will lose it*)

- 1. In r\_\_\_\_\_\_ this is temporary and will be lost.
- 2. In a dream j\_\_\_\_\_ this is temporary and will be lost.
- 3. In accumulating m\_\_\_\_\_ this too will be lost.

- •Jesus requires us to 1\_\_\_\_\_ our life in order to find life (*He* who loses his life for My sake will find it)
  - 1. We must s\_\_\_\_\_ our life to the Lord (we no longer have ownership. He does).
  - 2. We must receive Him as our 1\_\_\_\_\_ (Jn 14:6).
  - 3. This life is e\_\_\_\_\_.
- •The worth of my life is negotiable, but the worth of Jesus is not.

# Does your life demonstrate that Jesus is worth more than your loved ones? (34-37)

- •Jesus said that He did not come to bring p\_\_\_\_\_ on earth but a sword (34)
  - 1. Jesus did come to bring peace between b\_\_\_\_\_, regardless of their race (Eph 2:14).
  - 2. Jesus did not come to bring peace between the believing world and the unbelieving world (Jn 15:18).
- •It is unusual to see an entire f\_\_\_\_\_ become believers in Christ.
  - 1. In America, when a family member of a non-Christian family comes to Christ, they are treated as radical (in a bad way).
  - 2. Among the Islamic people, usually just one or two become believers in Christ within a family. They are usually
    - \_\_\_\_\_ by their family.
- •We are to 1\_\_\_\_\_ Jesus more than any loved one (v. 37)
  - 1. This puts a stamp of genuineness on the Christian f\_\_\_\_\_
    - a. The message of the Christian faith is good n\_\_\_\_\_
    - b. The reaction to the message is h\_\_\_\_\_
  - 2. This puts a stamp of genuineness on one's p\_\_\_\_\_\_faith.
- •The worth of Jesus is non-negotiable
