Since the next verse (v. 25) uses the term Messiah (literally, anointed one), we must understand the Most Holy to refer to a person, the Messiah. c. Jesus was anointed by God as the Christ when He was b (Matt 3:17) 5. Sometime after the 483 year period (26 A.D.), The Messiah would be c off and Jerusalem along with the temple would be completely destroyed (v. 26). a. Jesus died in 30 A.D. b. Jerusalem and the temple was completely destroyed on Aug 5, 70 A.D. (Eusebius, *History*, 3:7,8 – states the temple was destroyed 40 full years after Jesus's death). ●Only one suspect fulfills the role of The Messiah – Jesus of Nazareth
