Matthew 2:19-23

Introduction:

- A. Daniel prophesied of the year the Messiah would appear (Dan 9:25)
 - 1. The time has e_____ (roughly 26 AD)
 - 2. Luke 2:15 states that the people were in a state of e_____ and wondered if John the Baptist was the Christ.
- B. Only Jesus fulfilled _____ the prophecies
 - Many might qualify in some prophecies b_____ in Bethlehem (Mic 5:2) within a lifetime before 26 AD; descended from D_____ (Jer 23:5)
 - 2. Only Jesus fulfilled ______ the prophecies (Is 7:14 the virgin conception and virgin birth narrows the possibilities down to one).
- C. No one would want to pretend to be the Messiah because of the kinds of prophecies that must be fulfilled. These kinds of prophecies are summarized in Matt 2:23 *He will be called a Nazarene*.
