- C. A technical note on verse 26 it can be understood four ways.
  - 1. The Lord's servant is to be a verbal and living witness so that perhaps unbelievers come to their senses out from the devil's trap who has been holding them captive to do his will. (Almost all translations read with this sense).
  - 2. The Lord's servant is to be a verbal and living witness so that perhaps they may recover themselves out of the snare of the devil, having been taken captive by the Lord's servant unto the will of God. (The English Revised Version)
  - 3. The Lord's servant is to be a verbal and living witness so that perhaps unbelievers may be freed from the trap of the devil (who has been holding them captive) for the purpose of doing That One's will (referring to God). the Greek is literally, *That One's will*, and not simply *his will*.
  - 4. The Lord's servant is to be a verbal and living witness so that perhaps unbelievers will come to their senses out from the devil's trap, being captured ALIVE to that One's will.
    - a. The word capture is literally, *having been captured alive*. While in the possession of the devil, a person is not alive but dead in their trespasses and sins (Eph 2:1,2).
    - b. The word meaning *to capture alive* is in a tense that means they continue to be in a state of living.
    - c. Only God makes an unbeliever alive and keeps them in that state (Eph 2:5).
    - d. The picture is of an unbeliever coming to his senses and escaping the devil's trap because God has captured him to do His will.
- D. The point is that only God can bring about the salvation of a person. We must commit to the witnessing process and leave the results to God.

- 1) Watch your conversations develop the characteristics of not being quarrelsome but gentle in any correction to any opposition. If you fail, review what you should have said. Keep this up and verbal witnessing will become natural and normal.
