  - 1. First, read the passage in at least two translations (three is better) and understand the meanings of key words.
    - a. A word for word translation like the KJV or NAS

    - b. A phrase by phrase translation like the NIV or ESV Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything. (NIV)
    - c. A phrase by phrase translation with some interpretive liberties like the NLT.

      Dear brothers and sisters, when troubles come your way, consider it an opportunity for great joy. For you know that when your faith is tested, your endurance has a chance to grow. So let it grow, for when your endurance is fully developed, you will be perfect and complete, needing nothing. (NLT)
