#### How To Conquer Captivating Habits

The Physical and Psychological Level 1 Corinthians 6:12

#### Introduction:

- A. Addictive behaviors often times begin with a self-i\_\_\_\_\_\_ problem.
  - 1. If we put our identity at the mercy of others or of things, we will live an un\_\_\_\_\_ life.
  - 2. If we trust the identity that God has given us in Christ, it will motivate us to do what is r\_\_\_\_\_.
    - a. I Cor 5:17 you are a new creation in Christ. The old is gone and so the past no longer d\_\_\_\_\_ you.
    - b. Rom 8:17 God calls us His children and His h\_\_\_\_\_. There is no higher status.
    - c. 2 Tim 2:21 God sets us apart to serve His eternal p\_\_\_\_\_. There is no higher calling.
- B. Some addictive behaviors begin with curiosity and continue because it is pleasurable. This is a w\_\_\_\_\_ problem (Rom 1:21ff).
  - Living life to please the senses usually leads to going
     d\_\_\_\_\_\_ into the addictive behavior to get the same level
     of pleasure (e.g. harder drugs).
  - 2. God created us to worship Him (love Him above all else) and so there is nothing more satisfying than being fully d\_\_\_\_\_ to Christ (Jn 10:10).
- C. Once the spiritual problem is dealt with the physical and psychological levels can be addressed.
  - 1. The Bible views humans from three aspects (1Thess 5:23)
    - a. B\_\_\_\_\_(Gen 2:7)
    - b. S\_\_\_\_\_ (2 Cor 5:6-8; Jms 2:26; I Pet 3:19)
    - c. S\_\_\_\_\_(Matt 26:38,39)
  - 2. The solution must always flow from the spiritual to the physical or from the spiritual to the psychological.

## A\_\_\_\_\_ your problem to praying Christians (Eph 6:12, 18-20)

- A. Asking others to pray is asking them to join in the war against Satan's schemes (Eph 6:12) – prayer makes a d\_\_\_\_\_
  - 1. Paul needed b\_\_\_\_\_ in preaching the gospel (Eph 6:18-20)
  - 2. Paul needed this because of all the o\_\_\_\_\_\_ he received (2 Cor 11:23-27).
- B. What addictive habit are you dealing with?
  - 1. Confide in a person who will pray d\_\_\_\_\_ for you.
  - 2. Warning do not depend upon their prayers alone.

## S\_\_\_\_\_ yourself to constant prayer (Matt 26:37-41)

- A. When Jesus was about to face the path of suffering to the cross, He told His disciples that His s\_\_\_\_\_ was deeply grieved to the point of death.
  - 1. He was struggling p\_\_\_\_\_ (His mind, will, and emotions)
  - 2. He prayed intensely for an h\_\_\_\_\_\_ to bring His emotions and will in line with the Father's will.
- B. When Jesus finished His first session of prayer, He taught His disciples about its importance in overcoming temptation.
  - 1. Prayer must be c\_\_\_\_\_ (Greek text keep praying)
  - 2. Prayer empowers the s\_\_\_\_\_ and starves the f\_\_\_\_\_.
  - 3. How intense are you praying?

### O\_\_\_\_\_ tempting situations (2 Tim 2:22)

- A. Paul was writing to a young pastor, Timothy and commands him to
  - 1. R\_\_\_\_\_ from youthful lusts
  - 2. In other words, do not e\_\_\_\_\_\_ temptations.
- B. The following is the wrong way to deal with quitting addictions
  - 1. Alcoholism going into a b\_\_\_\_\_.
  - Tobacco have a smoke h\_\_\_\_\_ somewhere in the house.
  - 3. Overeating r\_\_\_\_\_ through the kitchen
- C. What happens when you fail?

# **R\_\_\_\_\_ yourself to God (1 Jn 1:9) -** Christians are to have the lifestyle of c\_\_\_\_\_ their sin.

- A. The word means to s\_\_\_\_\_ the same in other words, we are to view our sin as God does.
  - 1. He h\_\_\_\_\_, so you hate it repent
  - He views you (believer) as c\_\_\_\_\_ from all sin accept His f\_\_\_\_\_ and move on in Christ's power.
- B. Keep everything flowing from your spirit to your physical and psychological aspects.
