#### JESUS CHRIST'S SPIRITUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENT **Revelation 5**

#### Introduction:

- A. Our Church's financial statements

  - Is not merely i\_\_\_\_\_ and e\_\_\_\_\_
     Is a reflection of m\_\_\_\_\_ and s\_\_\_\_\_ in the name of Christ
- B. Revelation 5 uses f \_\_\_\_\_\_ terms to picture Christ's activity
  1. Can you find yourself in this financial statement?

  - 2. Can you sing the songs of this chapter?

### What did Jesus Christ e ? (1-7)

- A. First, let's review
  - 1. Chapter 4 is the beginning of this vision
    - The Father was sitting on the t\_\_\_\_\_, the Holy Spirit a. was before it, and heavenly beings were giving constant w\_\_\_\_\_ to the Father.
    - b. John did not see J\_\_\_\_\_ anywhere
  - 2. John was not immediately a\_\_\_\_\_ of how this part of the vision fit into the complete Revelation of God – it is not unusual for prophets to not understand what they are (e.g. Dan 12:8; 1 Pet 1:10,11; Rev 7:13,14).

## B. In chapter 5, John first notes that the Father has a s\_\_\_\_\_ in His right hand

- 1. It was filled up on both s\_\_\_\_\_ with writing.
- 2. It was sealed with s seals which kept the contents secure and secret.
- 3. The Father is waiting for someone w to take the scroll and break its seals
  - A search is made in every corner of h\_\_\_\_\_, of earth, a. and of the place of the d\_\_\_\_\_ ("under the earth").
  - b. No one was found worthy. This tells us that s\_\_\_\_\_ was not the qualification for being worthy, for there were many such beings (angels, 24 elders, 4 living creatures).
  - c. John began to w\_\_\_\_\_ greatly because no one was found worthy. (John did not realize that this portion of the vision was set in a time before Jesus went to the cross)
- C. Jesus earned worthiness John was told to look (vv. 5-7)
  - 1. John was told that The L\_\_\_\_\_ of Judah, the root of David has overcome (reference to the r\_\_\_\_\_ from the dead).

- 2. John saw a L\_\_\_\_\_ that looked like it had been
  - s standing among the throne of the Father.
  - a. The Lamb had seven e\_\_\_\_\_ which we are told symbolizes the Holy Spirit whom was sent into all the earth (Jn 16:8 – Jesus promised that the Holv Spirit would go and convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment).
  - b. The Lamb had seven h\_\_\_\_\_ this symbol is not interpreted for us.
- 3. John saw the LION and the LAMB take the scroll from the Father's right hand.

- What did Jesus Christ p\_\_\_\_? (8,9) A. John records that the 24 elders and the four living creatures sing a n\_\_\_\_\_ song (v. 9)
  - 1. It was new because it could not be sung until Jesus rose from the dead.
  - 2. The song praises Jesus for his worthiness because he purchased for God with His b\_\_\_\_\_ certain people.
    - a. These were not good people because no one is good except God a\_\_\_\_\_ (Rom 3:12; Mk 10:18)
    - b. These were s\_\_\_\_\_ (Rom 3:23)
- B. By this purchase Jesus became the m\_\_\_\_\_ or go-between God and believers which is pictured in verse 8 by the prayers of the saints being placed before Him.
- C. Jesus was i\_\_\_\_\_ in what sinful people He purchased from very tribe and tongue and people and nation.
  - 1. This is not universal salvation because Jesus will say to many d from Me into the eternal fire (Matt 25:41).
  - 2. This is salvation that includes people of every single k\_\_\_\_\_.
  - 3. John sees the purchase as c\_\_\_\_\_\_ even though from John's standpoint or ours it is not complete.
- D. Do you see yourself in this purchase?

# What did Jesus Christ g\_\_\_\_? (10-14)

- A. A kingdom of p\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 10 see Rev 1:6 notes)
  - 1. The believer is purchased to be a mediator between the world and Christ by sharing the g\_\_\_\_\_ (Rom 10:14-17)
  - 2. These will reign upon the e\_\_\_\_\_ (Rev 20:4; see also 2:26,27)
- B. A universe of h\_\_\_\_\_ (v. 11-14)
  - 1. All c beings honor Christ

- a. Those in h\_\_\_\_\_
- b. Those on e\_\_\_\_\_
- c. Those u\_\_\_\_\_ the earth.
- 2. Phil 2:10 prophesies of this every k\_\_\_\_\_ will bow, of those in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every t\_\_\_\_\_ will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of the Father.
- 3. This is a vision of that which is yet future

## **Conclusion:**

- A. Chapters 4 and 5 is a vision that begins in the past when Jesus first came to earth and goes to His second coming.
  - 1. Chapter 4 Jesus is missing in heaven
  - 2. Chapter 5
    - a. The Father has a scroll with seven seals that must be opened by one who is worthy.
    - b. No one is found to be worthy
    - c. Jesus becomes worthy by conquering death after sacrificing Himself as a lamb for believers.
    - d. Jesus sends the Holy Spirit throughout the whole earth to convict the world of sin.
    - e. Jesus eventually saves people from every walk of life through His kingdom of priests.
    - f. Jesus returns and the kingdom of priests reign with Him on the earth.
    - g. Every created being bows to Jesus and confesses Him as Lord.
- B. Do you see yourself reflected in this chapter? Has the transaction been made in your life? Personalize this vision:
  - 1. Verse 8 And when He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the 24 elders fell down before the Lamb, having each one a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which contain \_\_\_\_\_\_ prayers.
  - Verses 9,10: Worthy are You to take the scroll and break its seals, for you were slain and purchased for God with Your blood \_\_\_\_\_\_. And have made m\_\_\_\_ to be part of Your kingdom of priests. And I will reign on the earth with You.. \
  - 3. Verse 12 Worthy is the Lamb who was slain for me to receive power and riches and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing.

Is Jesus worthy? He Is!
